Feedback

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1) General Comments

- 1.1 Need to lay the groundwork for the unification of MC&Is (NF) and (FP). The fatiguing cycles for the review of the two standards need to be broken at some stage. NOW is the time!?
- 1.2 Proposal for a unified standard: MC&! (Forest Management).
- 1.3 Need for a structural framework for the organisation of Principles to reduce symptomatic repetitions and cross references.
 Balanced roles and contributions from different stakeholder groups.
 Facilitate training, monitoring and assessment.
- 1.4 Proposal for a hierarchy of Principles based on natural processes or practical progression Enable appraisal in phases.
 Reduce costs and demand on critical resources (including qualified certification
- 1.5 Need to review the current and corresponding "Audit Procedure"
- 1.6 Need pragmatic response to land use reality. Holistic forest management plan including plantation. (An illustration of the integration of P10 into the unified standard is attached as appendix).
