Corporate Profile

The Malaysian Timber Certification Council (MTCC) is an independent organisation established in October 1998 to develop and operate the voluntary Malaysian Timber Certification Scheme (MTCS). Incorporated under the Companies Act 1965 as a company limited by guarantee, MTCC is governed by a Board of Trustees and started its operation in January 1999.

MTCC's main activities are to:

- Be the national governing body (NGB) which has overall responsibility for the MTCS
- Support the standard-setting process by serving as the secretariat to the appropriate standard setting body in formulating standards related to timber certification and keeping them under review periodically
- Process applications for MTCS notification of Certification Bodies (CBs) operating forest management system and/or chain of custody certification and issuance of logo usage licences to Certificate Holders
- Conduct training for auditors from CBs operating forest management system and/or chain of custody certification
- Implement a procedure for the investigation and resolution of disputes, complaints and appeals related to its role as the NGB
- Liaise closely with the national accreditation body and other certification organisations in matters related to timber certification
- Coordinate with national, regional and international bodies related to timber certification to facilitate cooperation and mutual recognition arrangements
- Conduct programmes to promote and publicise the MTCS, both locally and internationally





CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT



012 was a busy year for all forestry and timberrelated stakeholders and organisations with countless meetings, workshops and conferences on numerous initiatives at national, regional and international levels, on how to meet the increasing demand for legal and sustainable timber. Some of these initiatives are backed by legislation enacted by importing countries. It seems that the whole world is brain-storming on how to address the forest crisis focusing on promoting the trade in legal and sustainable timber. Not surprisingly, the year ended with much anxiety and uncertainty on the part of all stakeholders and relevant government agencies in exporting countries. It is also to be noted that there is a perception that tropical timber is of high risk. Understandably, the timber industry is more than worried concerning its future. Is there a future for the industry? And if there is a future, where does that future lie?

The US Lacey Act has been implemented since 2008. The EU Timber Regulation with similar objectives, is due to come into force within the next three months, on 3 March 2013. The Australian Illegal Logging Prohibition Act, 2012 is expected to enter into force on 30 November 2014. Through its GOHO Wood Procurement Policy, Japan promotes the importation of legal and sustainable timber since April of 2006. GOHO wood, however, has a rather soft approach and

its verification process has some flexibility in its compliance auditing requirements. In the EU, public procurement is within the competence of its member states. Hence, there are varying processes and requirements. The Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) has also launched an initiative to combat illegal logging. To this end, an Expert Group on Illegal Logging and Trade (EGILAT) was created. Its second meeting was held in Kazan, Russia on 21-23 May 2012. The ITTO, FAO and UNFF, amongst others, have their own programmes and initiatives to combat illegal logging and trade in illegal timber. Nearer to home, ASEAN, has its own Working Group to develop a timber certification framework by phases with an initial phase to assure, timber legality. The inaugural meeting was held on 17-19 December 2002 in Kuala Lumpur. Malaysia is the lead country for this initiative and within Malaysia, MTCC is honoured to serve as the lead agency. In addition, MTCC is also actively involved in various meetings related to these initiatives.

From the foregoing it can be seen that there is a plethora of initiatives and programmes from the demand-side, with varying processes and requirements, all of which are designed to assure the importation of timber and timber products verified for legality. Understandably, there is a great deal of confusion amongst all affected parties to understand the different requirements demanded by these importing countries. Difficulties are acutely felt by tropical countries who are often without adequate resource persons to attend the numerous meetings. Time and financial resources are needed to do so. If attending all of them is problematic, understanding the various systems, is even more so. And meeting these requirements which vary from market to market in terms of definition of legality, documentation, details and procedures, is a nightmare. We must view the proliferation of initiatives, all intended to achieve common objectives, with serious concern. Having followed these developments closely in the last few years, I must appeal that the time has now come for the various parties responsible for these initiatives to come together to consider some form of coordination and harmonization. All of us must be concerned with the difficulties and confusion that tropical countries face in understanding, let alone implementing different systems for different markets. Exports will simply be diverted to other markets where no questions are asked. Such unintended consequences will lead to business as usual or even worse. No one wants this to happen.

With the anticipated entry into force of the EU Timber Regulation on 3 March 2013 indicated earlier, timber importers in the EU are obliged to exercise "due diligence" through a process of risk assessment so as to ensure that they are not importing timber and timber products which are harvested, processed and exported

in contravention of the laws of the exporting country. This process of due diligence involves the compilation of relevant information on the timber products to be imported, an assessment of the risk of the timber being illegal and as necessary, undertake mitigation measures to reduce such risks. Each EU member country will designate a Competent Authority who will be responsible for the enforcement of the Timber Regulation and also determine the penalties for non-compliances.

In addition to the "due diligence" process, the EU Timber Regulation also provides for timber products to enter markets in the EU through another channel for those exporter countries which have signed a Forest Law Enforcement, Governance and Trade Voluntary Partnership Agreement (FLEGT VPA) with the EU. Central to this bilateral agreement is a Timber Legality Assurance System (TLAS), the implementation of which assures the legality of the timber products exported from that partner country. The robustness and credibility of the TLAS is ensured through a third party compliance audit. Thus, FLEGT licenced timber is exempted from the "due diligence" process and enters the EU market through a "green lane" under the EU Timber Regulation.

As a responsible member of the international community, Malaysia is supportive of the EU FLEGT initiative and is negotiating to conclude a FLEGT VPA. Substantial progress has been made but there are a few outstanding issues still to be settled. The TLAS, which is at the heart of the VPA has been more or less finalized at the technical level after being subjected to several stakeholder consultations, a major technical evaluation, and five Joint Expert Meetings with EU experts. Pending the conclusion and signing of the FLEGT VPA, preparations are being made to implement the TLAS as a purely Malaysia initiative before the entry into force of the EU Timber Regulation with an initial phase for timber and timber products exported to the EU from Peninsular Malaysia. Since this is a Malaysian initiative, not linked to the FLEGT VPA, it is called MYTLAS (Peninsular Malaysia). Its implementation is complex as it involves eight agencies under five ministries. To ensure smooth implementation of the MYTLAS it is proposed that an implementing Agency Coordination Committee (IACC) be established to facilitate co-ordination and information flow. For purposes of governance, a TLAS Advisory Group (TAG) is also planned comprising representatives from NGOs, industry, forestry experts and key implementing agencies. An annual third party compliance audit will be undertaken. These measures are to ensure the robustness, and credibility of the MYTLAS licences which will be issued by the Malaysian Timber Industry Board (MTIB) as the licensing authority for the timber products to be exported to the EU countries from Peninsular Malaysia.

Implementation of MYTLAS, expected to commence early next year, will not be easy. There will be teething problems. It will be a challenge to the various implementing agencies, the licensing authority and the industry. More resources will be required. Equally, it must also be recognized that this is an opportunity for Malaysia to demonstrate our green credentials with benefits which will go beyond the timber industry. Although the Lacey Act has been implemented in the last five years, the US Justice Department had taken action only in one or two cases. Let this initial grace period of flexibility, not lull us into complacency and inaction. With some extra resources which Government should consider, in addition to assistance from the EU for capacity building, an enhanced level of cooperation and concerted efforts by all of us, we can and must deliver legal timber to the world in spite of initial difficulties and concerns from certain groups who are yet to be fully convinced. This is the only way forward for the timber industry to survive and thrive in view of the wave of green consumerism spreading around the world. MTCC had similar experiences during its early years.

The year marked the end of an era for MTCC with the retirement of its founding Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Mr. Chew Lye Teng who helmed the organisation since its inception in 1999. His dedication, tireless efforts and determination have contributed to MTCC's growth and development into the leading timber certification scheme in the tropical world. His contributions are therefore monumental. Let Mr. Chew's legacy, inspire MTCC to greater success to contribute to the conservation and sustainable management of our precious forest resources.

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS



TCC started the year with the implementation of the transition plan from the use of the MC&I(2002) to MC&I(Natural Forest), which stipulated a 17-month transition period beginning 1 January 2012 to 31 May 2013. The transition plan specified an application date of 1 July 2012 and a transition date of 1 June 2013 when the use of the standard becomes mandatory.

In line with the implementation of the transition plan, the recertification and surveillance audits of all the nine PEFC-certified Forest Management Units (FMUs) included the MC&I(Natural Forest) in their audit scope, while all new applications after 1 July 2012 were audited against the new standard.

In preparing the auditors of PEFC-notified CBs in Malaysia to conduct audits against the requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest), two auditor training courses were conducted; the first one-day training course for existing auditors, and the second four-

day course for new auditors. A one-day training course was also organised to familiarise the peer reviewers on the requirements of the new standard. In addition, six briefing sessions on the requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest) were also conducted for FMU managers, timber associations, concessionaires, as well as staff of the various forestry agencies in Sabah, Sarawak and Peninsular Malaysia.

To ensure that the MC&I(Natural Forest) is also covered under the original PEFC endorsement of the MTCS, MTCC submitted the MC&I(Natural Forest) for assessment by the PEFC which was approved by the PEFC Board of Directors on 5 October.

The year also saw the endorsement of the MC&I(Forest Plantations) by the PEFC with effect from 20 July. It is a significant development as the endorsement will enable and further encourage forest plantation managers and local companies which own or manage forest plantations to apply for forest plantation management certification under the PEFC scheme.

In order to streamline the operation of the MTCS, MTCC ceased the on-product use of the MTCC Logo on MTCS-certified products on 30 June 2012, in line with the decision made by the 50th meeting of the Board of Trustees. PEFC certificate holders are encouraged to use the PEFC Logo to take full advantage of the mutual recognition among the PEFC-endorsed schemes and to facilitate the promotion of PEFC-certified timber products under the MTCS.

With regard to the export of timber products certified under the MTCS, the export volume showed an increase of 16% from 96,722 m³ in 2011 to 112,098 m³ in 2012. Of the total volume exported, 64,836 m³ or 58% were PEFC-certified. The Netherlands remained as the biggest market, accounting for 30% of the total export, followed by the United Kingdom (26%). The year saw the inclusion of 10 new destinations for certified products under the MTCS, i.e. Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, Bahrain, Finland, China, Jordan, Sweden, Oman, Qatar and Kuwait.

Activities to promote and publicise the MTCS as a PEFC-endorsed scheme were continued through the participation and dissemination of publicity brochures during missions, business visits, conferences, seminars, workshops, trade fairs and exhibitions, through the *MTCC News* as well as through the one-to-one discussions held with key contacts by MTCC or its public relations representatives. MTCC also participated actively in the PEFC related activities, particularly in the PEFC 16th and 17th General Assemblies, and the PEFC Stakeholder Dialogue held in Vienna, Austria.

MTCC continued to contribute towards the implementation of three collaborative projects, i.e. (i) Formulation of Guidelines and Procedures for Social Impact Assessment and Monitoring of Forest Management Certification; (ii) Pilot Study on Group Certification of Rubber Smallholdings under the MTCS; and (iii) Conservation of Biodiversity through Improved Forest Planning Tools Project. MTCC also provided technical inputs through participation in the discussions and stakeholder consultations related to the on-going negotiations between Malaysia and the EU on the FLEGT VPA.

Operating a voluntary scheme, MTCC appreciates the continued cooperation, understanding and support of all the relevant stakeholder groups representing the social, economic and environmental interest groups as well as the relevant government agencies in Sabah, Sarawak and Peninsular Malaysia towards the implementation of its activities and initiatives in 2012. MTCC sincerely looks forward to continue working with all parties concerned to further promote and encourage the practice of sustainable forest management in Malaysia.

MTCC closed a significant chapter with the retirement of Mr. Chew Lye Teng on 31 December after a long and illustrious 14-year tenure serving as the founding CEO of MTCC. It is without doubt that the growth and development of MTCC and the international recognition and market acceptance of the MTCS are greatly attributed to his leadership of sheer dedication, commitment and determination. It is therefore only fitting that a special tribute be included in this report to record our gratitude and deepest appreciation to him for his immense contributions to MTCC and the MTCS.

As the new CEO, I am grateful to the Chairman and Board of Trustees, as well as the Members of MTCC, for their trust and confidence in me to lead the Council. I hope that with their continued guidance, support and encouragement, the work of MTCC and the MTCS would be brought to a higher level of achievement and recognition. I wish to express my sincere thanks to all the MTCC staff for the diligence shown and efforts taken in carrying out their duties and responsibilities.

A SPECIAL TRIBUTE TO MR. CHEW LYE TENG

fter serving 14 years as the founding CEO of MTCC, Mr. Chew Lye Teng retired on 31 December, ending his long and illustrious career at the council. His announcement to retire was a sad moment for both the MTCC Board and management, in view of his immense contributions to the growth and development of MTCC and the MTCS.

Mr. Chew was appointed the CEO of MTCC in 1999. Prior to his appointment, Mr. Chew served the Malaysian Timber Industry Board (MTIB) for 25 years from 1974 to 1998 in various capacities, including as the Director of the Development Division covering technical services. Mr Chew holds a Bachelor of Science (Honours) degree and Diploma in Education from the University of Malaya, as well as a Masters degree in Business Administration from the International Management Centres Multinational (IMC), Buckingham, United Kingdom.

As the founding CEO, Mr. Chew was tasked with the huge responsibility of ensuring that MTCC's vision "to be the leading timber certification scheme for tropical forests" and its mission "to establish and operate a credible and internationally recognised national timber certification scheme towards promoting sustainable forest management in Malaysia" come into fruition. A tall order indeed! However, it is without doubt that Mr. Chew proved to be equal to the challenge and achieved the mandate placed upon him *par excellence*.

Amidst all the challenges faced in institution building to establish a new organisation, Mr Chew provided outstanding leadership to the young MTCC through the most difficult initial years, and in developing and operating the MTCS. With much dedication and determination, Mr. Chew succeeded in raising the profile of MTCC and the MTCS to a level to gain international recognition and market acceptance. The endorsement of the MTCS by the PEFC Council in May 2009 is a historic milestone for the MTCS.

Other significant milestones achieved by Mr. Chew include incorporating MTCC as a company in 1999, launching of the MTCS in October 2001, implementing the new institutional arrangement for the MTCS in 2008, and the export of MTCS-certified products to cover 33 countries as at the end of 2012.

In appreciation of his immense contribution to MTCC, the MTCC management organised a farewell dinner for Mr. Chew on 22 December.

In his farewell speech, Mr. Chew expressed his sincere thanks and deep appreciation to MTCC Board of Trustees for their immense trust and confidence in him, as well as the guidance and support given to him throughout the 14 years. He also thanked the MTCC staff for the diligence and efforts that they had taken in carrying out their duties and responsibilities.

We wish Mr. Chew a 'Happy Retirement' and all the very best in his future undertakings.

Forest Management Certification

Eight of the nine PEFC-certified Forest Management Units (FMUs) underwent recertification audit and one FMU the surveillance audit against the *Malaysian Criteria and Indicators for Forest Management Certification* [MC&I(2002)] in 2012. Additionally, in line with the transition plan from the use of the MC&I(2002) to the *Malaysian Criteria and Indicators for Forest Management Certification (Natural Forest)* [MC&I(Natural Forest)], the audits also included the requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest) in the audit scope. However, any deviation from the additional requirements found in the MC&I(Natural Forest) as compared to the MC&I(2002) was raised as "observation" and not as "non-conformity".

Details regarding the date of issuance of certificates, CBs involved, and date of the surveillance and recertification audits, are as shown in **Table 1**.

A new FMU, i.e. Anap-Muput FMU located in Bintulu, Sarawak underwent a Stage 1 audit against the requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest) on 1-4 October.

In terms of the extent of the areas certified, the nine FMUs covered a total of 4,646,460 hectares of Permanent Reserved Forests (PRFs) in Malaysia as shown in **Table 2**.

Chain of Custody Certification

In 2012, a total of 27 timber companies were awarded the PEFC Certificate for Chain of Custody by five PEFC-notified CBs.

Of this total, 17 certificates were issued by the local CBs, i.e. 11 by SGS (Malaysia) Sdn. Bhd., five by SIRIM QAS International Sdn. Bhd. and one by Moody International Certification (Malaysia) Sdn. Bhd. The overseas-based CBs, SGS South Africa Pty Ltd and BM Trada Certification Ltd. of UK, issued seven and three certificates, respectively.

Besides the issuance of new certificates, 19 certificates were also withdrawn, while six certificate holders were suspended. The withdrawals were mainly due to requests from the companies, while the suspensions were due to the certificate holders not meeting the requirements of the chain of custody (CoC) standard. Not withstanding this, the total number of PEFC certificate holders by the end of 2012 increased to 180.

The full list of holders of the PEFC Certificate for Chain of Custody is as shown in Appendix I.

Phasing Out of MTCS-Certified Timber

Since February 2011, all the eight FMUs in Peninsular Malaysia (Negeri Sembilan, Johor, Terengganu, Kedah, Pahang, Perak, Selangor and Kelantan FMUs) and the Segaliud Lokan FMU in Sabah have obtained PEFC certification. This means that all the certified FMUs under the MTCS are producing PEFC-certified logs. The production of PEFC-certified logs from these FMUs is deemed to be adequate to meet the demand of the timber industry, particularly in Peninsular Malaysia.

Even though all the certified FMUs have been producing PEFC-certified logs since 2011, MTCC nevertheless acknowledged that some of the PEFC CoC certificate holders may still be holding stocks of MTCS-certified timber and timber products which are not eligible to be declared as PEFC-certified, and therefore cannot carry the PEFC Logo.

To streamline the operation of the MTCS, MTCC took action to cease the on-product use of the MTCC Logo on any of the MTCS-certified products after 30 June 2012. This action was taken in line with the decision made by the 50th meeting of the Board of Trustees. This meant that beginning 1 July, certificate holders were not allowed to use the MTCC logo on the MTCS-certified timber (i.e. no on-product use of the MTCC Logo).

MTCC is of the view that certificate holders which have qualified to use the PEFC Logo should use only one logo, i.e. the PEFC Logo, in order to take full advantage of the mutual recognition among the PEFC-endorsed schemes and to facilitate the promotion of PEFC-certified timber products under the MTCS. However, the MTCC Logo will continue to be shown in the certificates issued by the notified CBs.

Issuance of MTCC Logo Usage Licence

MTCC ceased the issuance of the MTCC Logo usage licence in 2012, as a result of its decision to phase out the on-product use of the MTCC Logo on MTCS-certified timber products after 30 June 2012.

The full list of the MTCC Logo usage licences issued by MTCC is as shown in Appendix II.

Issuance of PEFC Logo Usage Licence

In 2012, a total of 20 PEFC Logo usage licences were approved and issued by the Notification Committee, all to CoC certificate holders.

The full list of the PEFC Logo usage licences issued by MTCC is as shown in **Appendix III**.

The issuance fee and annual fee for the issuance of PEFC Logo usage licence remained unchanged as shown in **Table 3**.

Certification Bodies

On 14 September, two overseas-based CBs, namely BM Trada Certification Ltd. (BMT) of UK and Holz und Wald Zertifizierungsgesellschaft mbH (HW-Zert GmbH) of Germany, were PEFC-notified by MTCC to operate CoC certification under the MTCS.

With this addition, the total number of PEFC-notified CBs operating CoC certification increased to eight, while those operating forest management certification remained at two.

Table 4 shows the PEFC-notified CBs under the MTCS as at 31 December.

EXPORT OF TIMBER PRODUCTS CERTIFIED UNDER MTCS

he export of certified timber products showed an increase of 16% from 96,722 m³ in 2011 to 112,098 m³ in 2012. Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, Bahrain, Finland, China, Jordan, Sweden, Oman, Qatar and Kuwait became the latest destinations, adding to the existing list of 23 countries comprising The Netherlands, Belgium, Germany, the United Kingdom, France, Australia, Greece, Denmark, Poland, Italy, Norway, Indonesia, South Africa, South Korea, United States of America, Japan, the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Mauritius, New Zealand, Albania, Ireland, Singapore and the Philippines. The Netherlands continued to be the largest market receiving 36,901 m³ or 33% of the total volume exported in 2012.

As at the end of 2012, a total cumulative of 650,321 m³ of certified timber products had been exported, with The Netherlands constituting the biggest market, importing 310,582 m³ (or 48%) of the total quantity exported since July 2002.

The export of PEFC-certified products that started in September 2010 also increased significantly in 2012, partly due to the phasing out of the use of MTCC Logo on MTCS-certified products by the end of June. Of the total 112,098 m³ exported, 64,836 m³ or 58% were PEFC-certified, with the month of November recording the highest export figure of 8,800 m³. Hence, by the end of 2012, a total cumulative of 90,398 m³ of PEFC-certified products had been exported, with The Netherlands importing 27,011 m³ (or 30%), making it the largest market for PEFC-certified products from Malaysia, followed by the United Kingdom importing 23,076 m³ (or 26%).

Apart from sawn timber, plywood, mouldings, veneer, laminated finger-jointed timber, finger-jointed dressed timber (S4S), furniture and furniture components, door and window components, and laminated scantlings, the range of certified timber products exported also expanded to include paper-based products. In August, PEFC-certified paper products from Malaysia were shipped for the first time to Australia by Muda Paper Converting Sdn. Bhd. Another certificate holder, L.P Pacific Films Sdn. Bhd., also became an exporter of PEFC-certified paper products, exporting a total of 676 m³ in 2012.




Figure 1: Export of timber products certified under MTCS, July 2002 - December 2012

Figure 1 shows the export of timber products certified under the MTCS by month, as well as the cumulative volume since July 2002. **Figures 2** and **3** provide the percentage breakdown of the certified products exported in 2012 by product type and destination, respectively.

Figure 2: Export of timber products certified under MTCS by product type, 2012





Figure 3: Export of timber products certified under MTCS by destination, 2012

CERTIFICATION STANDARDS

Transition plan from the use of MC&I(2002) to MC&I(Natural Forest) under MTCS

Following the decision of the 49th Meeting of the Board of Trustees to adopt the MC&I(Natural Forest) to replace the MC&I(2002) as the new forest management certification standard under the MTCS, the 50th Meeting of the Board of Trustees held on 20 March adopted the *Transition Plan* to ensure a smooth transition from the use of the MC&I(2002) to the MC&I(Natural Forest) by 1 June 2013.

The 17-month transition period beginning 1 January 2012 to 31 May 2013 encompasses six months for application (required for introducing changes, disseminating information, training and endorsement of the new standard by the PEFC Council), i.e. an application date of 1 July 2012, and 11 months for transition before the standard becomes mandatory on the transition date of 1 June 2013.

Based on the Transition Plan, all notified CBs will be trained to carry out audits against the MC&I(Natural Forest) by 1 July 2012. Additionally, all holders of the *Certificate for Forest Management* and new applicants for forest management certification are required to adhere to the following:

- i. All holders of the *Certificate for Forest Management* to the MC&I(2002) are required to submit a plan for transition to their respective CB by 1 July 2012. The plan shall clearly indicate the end date for the transition process, which shall not go beyond 31 May 2013.
- ii. All applications for forest management certification against the MC&I(2002) received after 1 July 2012 will not be accepted.
- iii. After 1 July 2012, all the audits of certificate holders/applicants shall be against the MC&I(Natural Forest). However, any deviation from the additional requirements found in the MC&I(Natural Forest) as compared to the MC&I(2002) will be raised as "Observation" and not as "Non-conformity".
- iv. From 1 February 2013, all the "Observations" against the MC&I(Natural Forest) raised during the audits will be reviewed by the CB and classified as major/minor non-conformities and the findings will be communicated to the certificate holders/applicants for necessary corrective actions.
- v. Certificate holders/applicants found to comply with the requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest) will be awarded with a new certificate which shall be valid for three years.

Approval to include MC&I (Natural Forest) in PEFC – endorsed MTCS

The review of the MC&I(2002) culminated in the formulation and adoption of the MC&I(Natural Forest) by the multi-stakeholder Standards Review Committee (SRC) on 22 September 2011. The MC&I(Natural Forest) was subsequently adopted by the MTCC Board of Trustees as the new forest management certification standard for natural forest under the MTCS during its 49th meeting held on 6 December 2011.

In line with the transition plan from the use of the MC&I(2002) to the MC&I(Natural Forest), MTCC submitted the MC&I(Natural Forest), to the PEFC Council for assessment in accordance with *Annex 7: Endorsement and Mutual Recognition of National Schemes and their Revision* (PEFC Technical Document) on 16 April 2012.

Based on an assessment report by the PEFC's Panel of Experts, the PEFC Board of Directors decided at its meeting on 5 October 2012 to approve the changes in the currently endorsed MTCS to include the MC&I(Natural Forest). The MC&I(Natural Forest) with application date of 1 July 2012 is therefore covered under the PEFC endorsement of the MTCS until 1 May 2014.



Endorsement of MC&I(Forest Plantations)

The Malaysian Criteria and Indicators for Forest Management Certification (Forest Plantations) [MC&I(Forest Plantations)] was submitted by the MTCC for a reassessment against the PEFC ST 1003:2010, Sustainable Forest Management - Requirements in July 2011. Indufor Oy, the consultant appointed by the PEFC to undertake the reassessment, in its Final Report dated 5 September 2011 recommended the endorsement of the MC&I(Forest Plantations) as part of the PEFC-endorsed MTCS.

Subsequently, the MC&I(Forest Plantations) was endorsed by the PEFC General Assembly following a postal vote among the PEFC Members based on the recommendation of the PEFC Board of Directors and the evaluation report prepared by Indufor Oy.

The endorsement of the MC&I(Forest Plantations) with effect from 20 July 2012 enables the forest plantation managers and local companies which own or manage forest plantations to apply for forest plantation management certification under the PEFC scheme.

Training Courses on MC&I(Natural Forest) for Auditors and Peer Reviewers

In 2012, MTCC conducted three training courses on the requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest) as part of the transition plan from the use of the MC&I(2002) to the MC&I(Natural Forest).

i) Auditor Training Course for Existing Auditors

A one-day Auditor Training Course was conducted on 29 May for the existing auditors of the PEFC-notified CBs and accreditation body. The main purpose of the training course was to inform the auditors on the transition plan for the implementation of the MC&I(Natural Forest), and to familiarise them with the requirements of the new standard by highlighting the differences between the MC&I(2002)

and MC&I(Natural Forest) at the Principle, Criteria, Indicator and Verifier levels. A total of 19 auditors from SIRIM QAS International Sdn. Bhd, SGS (Malaysia) Sdn. Bhd. and STANDARDS MALAYSIA attended the training course.

ii) Auditor Training Course for New Auditors

A four-day Auditor Training Course was conducted in Kuala Pilah on 3 - 6 September to equip new auditors with the necessary knowledge and skills to conduct forest management certification audits based on the requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest). A total of seven (7) participants comprising auditors from SGS (Malaysia) Sdn. Bhd., and internal auditors from the Forestry Department Peninsular Malaysia Headquarters and Pahang State Forestry Department attended the course. The training programme included classroom lectures on the implementation of the MTCS, requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest), as well as accreditation requirements of CBs including the competency requirements for auditors, and various assessment tools used in forest management certification.

The programme also included a one-and-a-half-day field segment where the participants were required to conduct a trial forest management certification audit covering documentation review, consultation with relevant stakeholders and verification of forest management activities. In the course of the trial audit, the participants visited a logging camp, audited activities conducted in an active logging area and a recently logged-over forest area, as well as assessed the natural regeneration of a regenerated forest area. The participants also held consultation with an Orang Asli community at Pos Simoi Lama and inspected the chain of custody system in tracking the flow of forest products at the Kuala Medang Forest Checking Station.

iii) Training Course for Peer Reviewers

A one-day training course was conducted on 23 October to familiarise the peer reviewers with the requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest). Based on the Accreditation Document ACB-FMC 1-3: *Peer Reviewer Process Requirements for Certification Bodies Operating Forest Management Certification (Natural Forest) under the Malaysian Timber Certification Scheme*, it is required that the audit report for stage 2 audit or recertification audit prepared by the CB must be reviewed by two appointed peer reviewers to obtain a second and independent opinion on the level of compliance of the FMU concerned against the requirements of the agreed standard for forest management certification. The training course was attended by a total of six participants, with emphasis being given to the accreditation requirements and role of peer reviewers, in addition to the requirements of the MC&I(Natural Forest).

At the briefing sessions, the *Transition plan from the use of the MC&I(2002) to the MC&I(Natural Forest) under the MTCS* was also elaborated and explained to ensure a smooth transition in the use of the MC&I(Natural



Bhd. and Grand Perfect Sdn. Bhd. The field component of the training course was coordinated by Grand Perfect Sdn. Bhd.

The training programme included lectures on the MTCS, requirements of the MC&I(Forest Plantations), as well as competency requirements of CBs with special reference to the qualification of auditors and technical experts. The programme also included a one-and-a-half-day field segment where the participants were required to conduct a trial forest management certification audit to assess the forest plantation practices of Sarawak Planted Forest Sdn. Bhd. against the requirements of the MC&I(Forest Plantations).

- ii) to explore opportunities for investment in Myanmar and to enhance economic cooperation in upstream and downstream activities, as well as increase market share for Malaysian commodities in Myanmar.

MTCC's participation in the visit was related to its cooperation with the Timber Certification Committee of Myanmar (TCCM), which is a committee established under the Myanmar Ministry of Environmental Conservation and Forestry to establish the Myanmar Timber Certification Programme (MTCP).

During Tan Sri Dompok's courtesy call on the President of Myanmar, H.E. Thein Sein, the President stressed that the Myanmar government accorded high priority to attracting investments in industries to process its natural resources such as timber, so as to add value and provide employment and skills to its people. With the lifting of the trade sanctions since June 2011, the timber industry

and trade is giving more attention to sustainable forest management and timber certification which are now important requirements for the export of timber and timber products to the international market.

In conjunction with the visit, MTC and the Myanmar Timber Merchants Association (MTMA) jointly organised a *Seminar on Timber Trade Development* in Yangon on 1 November. MTCC made a presentation on the implementation of the MTCS and its achievements.

In relation to this visit, following a request from the TCCM, CEO Chew Lye Teng visited Myanmar on 3-7 December to observe and provide feedback to the TCCM on various aspects related to the development and implementation of the MTCP.

Key Activities in Germany

On 12 November, CEO Chew Lye Teng participated in the following activities that were organised by KaiserCommunication GmbH, MTCC's PR representative in Germany:

- i) A discussion in Stuttgart with Werner Erb from the Baden-Wurttemberg Ministry for Rural Area and Consumer Protection, Department of Forestry Policy which is in charge of the procurement policy of the State of Baden-Wurttemberg in south Germany to keep the department updated on the developments in the implementation of the MTCS;
- ii) A reception at the new office of PEFC Germany in Stuttgart at which MTCC handed over two sets of PEFC-certified garden furniture (mixed Meranti timber) which had been exhibited earlier in exhibitions/fairs in Germany, such as the SPOGA fair. Present at the reception were PEFC Germany Deputy Chairman Professor Hans Kopp and Secretary General Dirk Teegelbekkers, together with the representatives of organisations which support PEFC Germany. At the reception, Chew thanked PEFC Germany for its close cooperation with MTCC and updated the guests present of the latest developments in the MTCS; and
- iii) A discussion in Frankfurt with Stefan Essel, who deals with forest-related sustainability initiatives at the Society for International Cooperation (GIZ, formerly GTZ). The discussion with Stefan Essel dealt with the developments related to the assessment of the MTCS by the TPAC in The Netherlands, and the German federal procurement policy. Stefan Essel informed that the German federal procurement policy which currently accepts PEFC, FSC or equivalent schemes as providing proof of sustainable timber will be undergoing a review in 2013.

Bhd, Doormaster Industries Sdn. Bhd. and Professional Surfaces Sdn. Bhd., formed the Malaysia Pavilion at the exhibition covering a total floor space of 48 m². MTCC's participation was part of its efforts to promote the MTCS and PEFC-certified timber products from Malaysia in the Middle East markets.

The feedback obtained from the majority of the visitors to the MTCC booth shows that at this juncture, there is still not much awareness of timber certification and a minimal demand for certified timber products in many of the Middle East markets. MTCC booth displayed information pertaining to timber certification, the MTCS, certified timber products available and export destinations, and PEFC endorsement of the scheme.

MTCC met up with a number of government agencies and timber product importers, including the Dubai Municipality (Building Studies Section) which controls licensing and issuance of building permits, the Society of Engineers, the Emirates Green Building Council, and five importers. Two of the companies are holders of both the PEFC and FSC chain of custody certificates, and deal with certified timber imported from Europe and North America.





PAM CPD Talk 2012: Certifying Timber Products under the PEFC System

The Malaysian Institute of Architects (PAM - Pertubuhan Arkitek Malaysia) hosted a seminar on PEFC certification as part of its Continuing Professional Development (CPD) talk. The seminar took place on 23 April in Kuala Lumpur.

The talk which was co-hosted by PEFC and APP Timber addressed the issue of timber certification and the rationale for its implementation. Sarah Price from PEFC, Harnarinder Singh from MTCC and Michael Hermens from Malaysian based-APP Timber made presentations respectively on timber certification under the PEFC system, the PEFC-endorsed MTCS in Malaysia and the supply of certified timber products available in Malaysia to a crowd of nearly 40 participants.





RECOGNITION OF MTCS

PUBLIC PROCUREMENT POLICIES

As a PEFC-endorsed scheme, the MTCS has been accepted under the national timber procurement policies of Denmark, the United Kingdom, Germany, Finland, Belgium, Switzerland, France, New Zealand and the Keurhout System of The Netherlands as meeting the requirements for sustainable timber.

In addition, the authorities in the following countries have recognised and accepted the MTCS on its own merit.



Japan

The MTCS is listed as one of the certification schemes in the *Guideline for Verification on Legality and Sustainability of Wood and Wood Products* issued by the Forestry Agency, Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, Japan. (April 2006)

The Netherlands

The Dutch Ministry of Housing, Spatial Planning and Environment (VROM) has accepted the MTCS certificate as meeting the requirements for legality of timber. (April 2007)






Germany

GREEN BUILDING SYSTEMS

As a PEFC-endorsed scheme, the MTCS is also recognised under the green building systems of Australia, Italy, Singapore, The Netherlands, UK, Canada, USA, Japan and Abu Dhabi, UAE.





Recognition of MTCS by Abu Dhabi Urban Planning Council



The Pearl Rating System for Estidama published by the Abu Dhabi Urban Planning Council in April 2010 is one of Estidama's (which means 'sustainability' in Arabic) key initiatives for a model of sustainable urbanisation.

Estidama is the first programme of its kind that is tailored to the Middle East region. Its aim is to create more sustainable communities, cities and global enterprises, and to balance the four pillars of Estidama i.e. environment, economic, cultural and social.

The Pearl Rating System for Estidama aims to address the sustainability of a given development throughout its lifecycle from design through construction to operation. The Pearl Rating System is organised into seven categories that are fundamental to more sustainable development.

One of the seven categories in the Rating System related to Stewarding Materials encourages the use of timber sourced from legal and sustainable sources. As a

PEFC-endorsed scheme, the MTCS, is listed as one of the acceptable schemes along with the Canadian Standards Association (CSA) and Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) of USA.

PEFC 16th and 17th General Assemblies

The 16th and 17th General Assemblies (GA) of the PEFC Council were held on 16 November in Vienna, Austria. There were two GAs instead of the usual one because the PEFC Council is located in Switzerland and under Swiss laws, the results of the postal ballot carried out earlier regarding a motion on the budget and membership fees, and a motion on the revision of the voting system, had to be approved by the 16th GA before they could take effect in the 17th GA.

The GAs were attended by the PEFC Members (comprising NGBs and International Stakeholders) and Extraordinary Members, invited guests and members of the Board of Directors. MTCC was represented by its CEO, Chew Lye Teng.

The 16th GA confirmed the results of the postal ballot with regard to the motions on the budget and membership fees, and revision of the voting system. At the 17th GA, PEFC Secretary General, Ben Gunnerberg presented the highlights of the PEFC for the year 2011, which included positive growth in the number of chain of custody certificates that increased by 10.6% (9501 certificates) and the increase of 3 million ha of certified forest area (1.3%), bringing the total forest area certified under the PEFC to 245 million ha. There were five new member applications with 15 potential new members.

Among the activities that were carried out to promote the PEFC scheme were: increased market outreach, enhanced engagement and visibility, enhanced acceptance in procurement, revised standards, the use of new communication tools, revised voting system and budget, and increased support to potential members.

Two major challenges faced in promoting the PEFC scheme were also highlighted, i.e. the TPAC decision on the MTCS and the fifth revision of the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) rating system of the US Green Building Council, which still only accepts FSC-certified timber. In connection with the TPAC decision on the MTCS, Ben Gunnerberg thanked the national PEFC schemes which provided support in the ongoing EU infringement procedure taken by the MTC against The Netherlands.

Other important developments were the acceptance of the Indonesian Forest Certification Cooperation (IFCC) as a new member of PEFC, the participation of Barber Cho, representing the Myanmar Timber Merchants Association, and the interest expressed by the Sustainable Green Ecosystem Council (SGEC) which is a home-grown scheme from Japan, to join the PEFC. The participation of these countries indicates the growing recognition and acceptance of the PEFC scheme in the Asia Pacific region.

PEFC Stakeholder Dialogue

Prior to the General Assemblies, a PEFC Stakeholder Dialogue was held on 14 November, followed by a PEFC Council Members Day Meeting on 15 November.

The Dialogue with the theme *Strengthening the Link: Sustainable Biomass & Forest Certification* was attended by 160 participants representing a wide variety of organisations from the bio-energy and forest sectors.

The keynote address entitled "Framing the Debate around Forests & Biomass" was presented by Uwe Fritsche from the International Institute for Sustainability Analysis and Strategy (IINAS).

Three concurrent sessions were held during the Dialogue, which examined the subject matter in greater detail as follows:

- i) Exploring Expectations & Requirements Renewable Energy & Sustainable Forests;
- ii) Delivering Sustainable Forest Biomass in the Market; and
- iii) Meeting Expectations & Safeguarding Forests.

The key points from the Dialogue were:

- i) The Dialogue was quite Euro-centric, mainly focusing on the requirements of sustainable energy (bio-energy) from biomass (agricultural and forest biomass) resulting from the implementation of the EU Renewable Energy Directive (RED) and the UK Department of Energy and Climate Change;
- ii) Wood is the most important renewal biomass;
- iii) It is important for the forest certification schemes (both PEFC and FSC) to talk to the energy sector to let them know what the schemes were doing, and their ability to meet the requirements of this new market to deliver sustainable biomass for the bio-energy that would meet the requirements of the RED;
- iv) The need to avoid 're-inventing the wheel' i.e. it would be better for the existing forest certification standards to be slightly modified (if necessary) so as to deliver sustainable forest biomass rather than having new initiatives to come up with suitable criteria and indicators for sustainable biomass; and
- v) PEFC was urged to form a working group to discuss the issue of sustainable biomass with the energy sector.

CERTIFIED FORESTS UNDER VARIOUS CERTIFICATION SCHEMES

The total area of certified forest worldwide saw an increase of 3.64%, increasing from 394.03 million ha in 2011 to 408.38 million ha in 2012.





Figure 4: Certified forests under the various certification schemes (ha)

The certified forest area represented about 10% of the total global commercial forest area. Of this total, 237.65 million ha (58.20%) were certified under the PEFC scheme which included the MTCS (4.65 million ha or 1.14%), 169.32 million ha (41.46%) under the FSC scheme, and 1.40 million ha (0.34%) under the Lembaga Ekolabel Indonesia (LEI) (**Figure 4**).

Of the total extent of PEFC-certified forests, Europe accounted for 82.71 million ha. Outside Europe, besides the MTCS which accounted for 4.65 million ha, the PEFC-certified forests also included 44.26 million ha under the Canadian Standards Association (CSA), 92.57 million ha under the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) and American Tree Farm System (ATFS) of the USA, 10.10 million ha under the Australian Forestry Standard (AFS), 1.89 million ha under the Chilean Standard for Sustainable Forest Management (CERTFOR), and the balance of 1.22 million ha under the Brazilian Programme of Forest Certification (BPFC).

In terms of geographical distribution **(Figure 5)**, more than half (55.48%) of the world's certified forests were located in North America, with around one-third (34.52%) in Europe. The certified forest area outside Europe and North America only accounted for 10.00% of the global total, of which 2.58% was in the Asia-Pacific region.

Eleventh Meeting of Working Group on a Pan ASEAN Timber Certification Initiative

The Working Group on a Pan ASEAN Timber Certification Initiative (WG) is an initiative among the ASEAN Member States to coordinate and exchange information related to the implementation of timber certification. Malaysia is the lead country for the WG, and within Malaysia, MTCC is the lead agency.

The Eleventh Meeting of the WG was held on 22-23 May in Luang Prabang, Lao PDR. The Meeting was attended by delegates from six ASEAN Member States i.e. Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar and Thailand. A representative from the European Union (EU) FLEGT Asia Programme was also present to report on training activities related to the WG's work carried out under the Programme.

The Meeting took note of the updates by the ASEAN Secretariat on the key decisions of the Special SOM-32nd, SOM-33rd AMAF, SOM-11th AMAF Plus Three, 33rd AMAF Meeting and ASEAN Summit, as well as the key documents providing policy guidance in implementing the ASEAN Economic Community (AEC) Blueprint. The Meeting agreed that the AEC Scorecard regarding the development of a regional reference framework on phased approach to forest certification would be updated based on the country reports presented during the Meeting.

Following the conclusion made during the Tenth Meeting with regard to the targets set within the AEC Blueprint for trade in legal and sustainable timber, the Meeting reiterated that the ASEAN would need to specify how such requirements for legal and sustainable timber could

be put into operation so that they could be met by timber product manufacturers and exporters within the ASEAN market. The Meeting considered and discussed the first draft of the Terms of Reference (ToR) for the consultant, developed and presented by Malaysia, to take stock of these existing initiatives and consider these initiatives as references to meet the targets set in the AEC Blueprint. The Meeting agreed that the requirements would need to take into account and give due recognition to various existing initiatives for ensuring legal and sustainable timber that are already undertaken within the ASEAN Member States. The Meeting was further informed by the ASEAN Secretariat that funding support would be available from the ASEAN-German Programme on Response to Climate Change: Agriculture, Forestry and Related Sectors (GAP-CC) for this project.

The Meeting was informed by the ASEAN Secretariat that the "ASEAN Guidelines for Chain of Custody of Legal and Sustainable Timber" had been published at the end of 2011 and a soft copy of the document is available in the ASEAN Secretariat website.

The EU-FLEGT Asia Programme presented the outcome of the Second Sub-Regional Training Workshop on Timber Legality Assurance that was held on 25-27 October 2011 in Kota Kinabalu. The Meeting commended and appreciated the support from the EU FLEGT Asia Programme for the conduct of the said training workshop. The meeting noted the

proposal for the conduct of the Third Sub-Regional Training Workshop on Timber Legality Assurance for the Mekong region, as well as a proposed study on customs cooperation.

Country reports and updates on the development of C&I for legality of timber, sustainable forest management or forest management certification, as well as the implementation of timber certification were presented by the representatives of the respective ASEAN Member States.

In addition, Indonesia and Malaysia shared their respective experiences on the negotiation with the EU on a Voluntary Partnership Agreement (VPA), highlighting the control mechanisms being put in place such as the *Sistem Verifikasi Legalitas Kayu (SVLK)* and the Timber Legality Assurance System (TLAS) by the respective countries. The meeting also took note of the presentations by Lao PDR and Thailand on their preparations for formal VPA negotiations with the EU.

In conjunction with the Meeting, the delegates also participated in a field visit to a certified community teak plantation under a group certification programme and a certified wood processing factory.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

EU Forest Law Enforcement, Governance and Trade Voluntary Partnership Agreement (**EU FLEGT VPA**)

MTCC continued to provide technical support to the ongoing negotiations between Malaysia and the European Union (EU) on the EU FLEGT VPA by participating in the National Steering Committee meetings, relevant working group meetings, as well as the stakeholder consultations and briefings. In the preparation towards meeting the requirements of the EU Timber Regulation (EUTR) which would come into force on 3 March 2013, prohibiting the placement of illegally harvested timber and products derived from such timber on the EU market, MTCC also participated in the various discussions to finalise the Timber Legality Assurance System (TLAS).

Project on Formulation of Guidelines and Procedures for Social Impact Assessment and Monitoring of Forest Management Operations

Following the decision of the Sixth Meeting of the Project Technical Committee (PTC) held on 15-16 December 2011, the third draft of the *Guidelines and Procedures for Social Impact Assessment of Forest Management Operations* was subjected to a second one-month public comment from 3 January to 2 February.

The comments received from the public comment period were compiled and considered by a special meeting held on 15-16 February, which was attended by members of the PTC as well as representatives from the Forestry Department Headquarters Peninsular Malaysia, State Forestry Departments, Department of Orang Asli Development (JAKOA), State JAKOA, and the project consultants. The aim of the special meeting was to involve more stakeholders to provide further feedback on the content and practicability of the Guidelines.

Subsequently, the Seventh Meeting of the PTC was held on 15 March to deliberate on the final draft, with the meeting agreeing to amend the title of the document to *Guidelines and Procedures for Social Impact Assessment and Monitoring*



of Forest Management Operations (Peninsular Malaysia) to take into account the fact that the scope of the project was confined to Peninsular Malaysia.

Further editorial changes were made to the final draft during the Eighth and Ninth Meetings of the PTC held on 12 April and 7 September, respectively. The English and Bahasa Malaysia versions of the *Guidelines and Procedures for Social Impact Assessment and Monitoring of Forest Management Operations (Peninsular Malaysia)* and the Project Final Report were finalised at the Ninth Meeting of the PTC. It is envisaged that both the documents will be printed for circulation by early 2013.

Pilot Study on Group Certification of Rubber Smallholdings under MTCS

This project is spearheaded by the Malaysian Timber Industry Board (MTIB) in collaboration with MTCC, MTC, Malaysian Furniture Promotion Council (MFPC), Malaysian Rubber Board, Federal Land Development Authority (FELDA), Rubber Smallholders Development Authority (RISDA) and Federal Land Consolidation and Rehabilitation Authority (FELCRA). The project aims to explore the feasibility of implementing group certification of rubber smallholdings under the MTCS.

A FELDA scheme located at Bukit Rokan, Negri Sembilan, involving 382 smallholders and covering a land area totalling 1,257.21 ha with varying stages of rubber plantation, was identified and selected as the project site for the conduct of the study.

Two briefings were held on 22 and 29 March to brief the leaders ('block leaders') and the smallholders respectively to create awareness and inform the smallholders on the aims and potential benefits in participating in the project, as well as to obtain cooperation from the smallholders in the conduct of the study. Another meeting was held with the management of FELDA Bukit Rokan and the 'block leaders' on 11 October to further discuss the administrative arrangement for participation in the project.

Throughout the year, the Project Technical Committee met three times on 6 March, 18 May and 17 December to provide technical advice on the implementation of the project activities. The Project Steering Committee met once on 19 July to monitor the implementation of the project and approve the draft manual on the administrative arrangements for managing the smallholders for group certification under the MTCS.

In support of this initiative, the PEFC through the *Expanding Group Certification Globally Project* expressed interest to offer assistance in terms of providing a mentor with knowledge and experience in PEFC's group certification procedures to share experience and provide technical advice to the study. An exploratory meeting for this support was held between MTCC, MTIB and the project consultant with Sarah Price of PEFC on 4 October in Kuala Lumpur.

Conservation of Biodiversity through Improved Forest Planning Tools Project (CBioD Project)

The Conservation of Biodiversity through Improved Forest Planning Tools Project (CBioD Project) is a five-year project funded by contributions from the United Nations Development Programme-Global Environment Facility (UNDP-GEF), International Tropical Timber Organization (ITTO), Forest Research Institute Malaysia (FRIM), University of Miami & Duke, USA and Perak Integrated Timber Complex (PITC).

With the main objective to develop tools and generate knowledge to ensure that forestry production systems are planned and managed in a way to contribute to biodiversity conservation, the project which commenced in April 2007 was completed in August 2012.

A number of researches/studies were carried out to incorporate biodiversity concerns into management planning.

The following are key outputs of the project:

- Rapid Biological Diversity Assessment Manual (also known as Perak Tool)
- Virgin Jungle Reserve (VJR) Study
- Forest Regenerative Capacity Model
- Model for Predicting Biodiversity using Different Sampling Techniques
- Hydrology/Watershed Study
- Study on Water Treatment Cost for Potable Water
- Recreational and Non-Timber Forest Products (NTFP) Study
- Forest Harvesting Planning Tool

Subsequent to the completion of the project, the CBioD Resource Centre was established. This centre is funded by FRIM for a duration of twelve months to monitor and assist the implementation of the Perak Tool.


